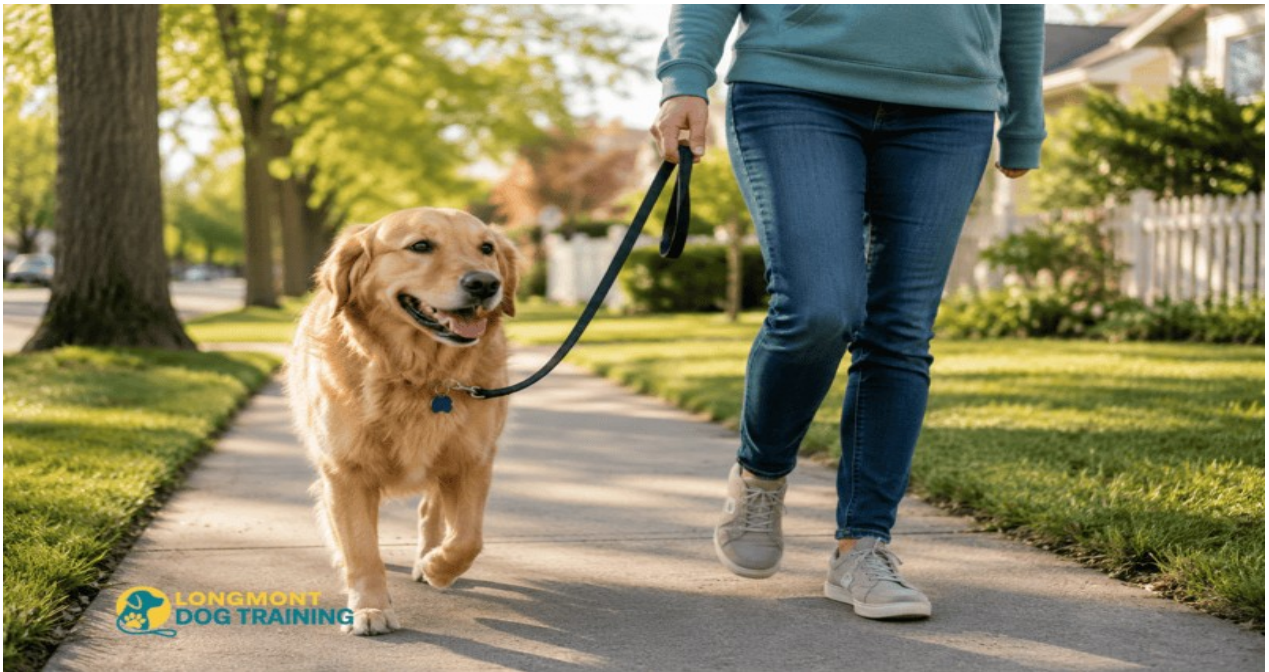




Longmont Dog Training Addresses Growing Demand for Real-World Training Methods
